



MARCH MEDAL COMPETITION 2010

Four Medal Competitions will be held in 2010. The 1ST Medal Competition of the year will be held in March. The qualifying period will be from 1st March to 26th March. Last squad for daily qualifying is at 10.30 pm. The last squad for this competition will be at 7.00 pm on Friday, 26th March 2010. This event is open to all SRC members of age 18 & above as of March 2010.

Bowlers will bowl a series of **3** games during the qualifying rounds. There is no limit to the number of attempts a bowler can make. After each attempt, the bowlers will have to give way to the next batch of bowlers on the waiting list. 2 lanes will be reserved at all times for this event during the qualifying period.

Bowlers can also attempt to qualify for the Medal Finals during the Monday Night Mixed League and the Saturday Social Singles Mixed League. Bowlers will have to inform the Bowling counter staff of their intention to do so before the league commences.

The top **12** Ladies and the Top **20** Men will bowl in the Medal Finals on 28th March 2010.

Qualifying fee per attempt is \$5.35 for Bowling Section members and \$10.75 for Non Bowling Section members. Fees for the finals will be \$12.84 for Bowling Section members and \$18.19 for Non Bowling Section members. **Bowlers will pay the above fees in addition to the games fees.**

Finals

- Ladies (12 games) - Sunday, 28th March 2010
 - Check in time 9.30 am
 - Last call for finalist 9.45 am
- Men (12 games) - Sunday, 28th March 2010
 - Check in time 2.00 pm
 - Last call for finalist 2.15 pm

Note:

After the last call has been made (once) and where there are absentees, the reserves will be called. There will be no limit to the number of bowlers on the reserves list.

The Esplanade Bowl's clock will be the official timepiece.

Each bowler will bowl 12 games in the finals. The bowler with the highest total pinfalls at the end of the competition will be declared the winner.

In the event of a tie in the finals and qualifying rounds, the bowler with the highest game will be the winner. Should a further tie occur during the finals, the bowlers will share the prizes and the points allocated.

The standard Bowling Bye-Law for bowling attire will be applied throughout the competition. The Esplanade Bowl House Awards will not apply during the qualifying rounds. However, the House Awards will apply for games bowled during the finals.

Bowler of the year

12 Ladies and 16 Men with the highest number of points accumulated from the four Medal Competitions and who have bowled in at least two medal finals will be invited to bowl in The Bowler of the Year Finals on 4th December 2010.
