



OFFICIAL CLARIFICATION TO MEMBERS

The Management Committee (MC) is aware of several falsehoods circulating in the lead-up to the Annual General Meeting. Following feedback and queries from members seeking clarification, we would like to provide a clear and factual account of these matters.

1. Membership Matters

a) Allegation: Wrongful termination of membership

Membership terminations arise strictly from non-payment of dues. They are carried out in accordance with Rule 26 of the Club's Constitution, which sets out a clear process for late payment notice, registered reminder, suspension, reinstatement window, and eventual cessation only after extended non-payment.

Members are given multiple opportunities over several months to regularise their accounts.

At the point of termination:

- Transformation-related: 45 members
- Land lease renewal: 95 members

Following engagement efforts, these have been reduced to:

- Transformation-related: 21 members
- Land lease renewal: 64 members



Where dues remain unpaid despite this process, the Club has taken necessary steps to recover outstanding amounts through the Small Claims Tribunals. This is not punitive; it is a standard and necessary step to protect the Club's finances and ensure fairness to members who have paid.

b) Allegation: Lady members were forced to convert at an exorbitant price

The Club offered a voluntary Optional Conversion Exercise (1 Aug 2022 – 31 Jan 2023), with a promotional launch fee of \$100, alongside subsidies.

This was introduced to allow Lady Members to access full Ordinary Membership rights, including voting rights, nomination of spouse and junior members, and eventual eligibility for Veteran Membership.

Ordinary Membership carries greater privileges and higher subscription fees (approximately double that of Lady Membership). It would not be equitable for Lady Members to receive full Ordinary rights without a conversion fee, given that existing Ordinary Members have paid full value.

c) Allegation: MC uses high-handed methods to bring members to the Disciplinary Committee

This allegation is not accurate. Disciplinary matters are managed through the Club's Rules & Membership Sub-Committee, which is tasked with ensuring that cases are handled fairly and objectively. For each case, an independent panel is formed, and the Club's administrative staff act only as secretariat to support the process. Importantly, the Management Committee does not know, nor has visibility into, the identities of the complainant and respondent during the case period. This structure ensures impartiality, confidentiality, and due process in the handling of all disciplinary matters.

2. Club Finances

a) Allegation: Additional top-up for Transformation Project

This allegation is not true. The Transformation Project is progressing smoothly within the approved budget and there is no intention to seek any additional top-up. Updates on the project's progress and financials have been regularly shared with members, including through Townhall presentations, to ensure transparency and accountability.

The above Transformation project budget was presented in the Townhall session on 31 January 2026.

b) Allegation: Increase in Minimum Spending Scheme (MSS)

This allegation is not true. The Management Committee has no intention to increase the Minimum Spending Scheme following the election. There are no plans under consideration to adjust the current MSS structure.

3. F&B Pricing at Poolside Café

The increase in prices at the Poolside Café has been carefully calibrated and remains in line with, or even below, prevailing market standards. A review of comparable menu items between 2022 and 2026 shows that most price adjustments over the past four years fall within a 10% to 20% range, which is broadly aligned with cumulative inflation and rising operating costs in the post-COVID period.



While a small number of items have seen increases of up to approximately 30%, these are primarily attributable to enhancements in menu offerings, volatility in ingredient costs, and the repositioning of the café's overall experience.

For instance, Butter Chicken has increased from \$13.80 to \$14.90 over the period, representing a total increase of 8%, or approximately 2% per annum. Similarly, Chicken Rice has increased from \$8.80 to \$9.90, representing a total increase of 12.5%, or about 3% per annum. These adjustments remain broadly in line with inflationary trends in Singapore, and the Club has consciously kept staple items as accessible as possible to ensure continued value for members.

4. Sports-Related Concerns

a) **SRC @ Ayer Rajah: Increase in development cost**

The \$800K presented at the 2025 EOGM covered only the main field.

The final ~\$2M reflects a full facility development, enabled by a new Managing Agent with stronger financial capacity. The MC had already indicated that additional facilities would be determined later.

Importantly:

- Fully funded by the Managing Agent
- No Club capex, no levies, no subscription increase
- No financial risk to the Club



As there is no Club capital expenditure, no EOGM approval for capex was required. The EOGM engagement was to seek approval for the SLA commitment, not funding.

b) SRC @ Ayer Rajah: Managing Agent and conflict of interest concerns

The appointed Managing Agent is Vantage Arena Pte Ltd.

The original MA (TEHC) withdrew after proposing revised terms that would have shifted costs to the Club. The MC rejected these to protect members' interests.

During the transition, a related party (the Club President's brother) initially stepped forward as a shareholder. This was declared transparently. To avoid any perceived conflict, the MC required a replacement. He is no longer a shareholder.

c) Cricket Section status

Claims that cricket was “removed” are incorrect.

The section faced:

- Ageing player base
- Low participation (~25% active)
- Limited pipeline
- ~38% win rate over 5 years



The decision taken was not to abandon cricket, but to rebuild it properly. GCB has also communicated this via letter to the section members. This includes transitioning away from the existing structure, working with the Singapore Cricket Association, and developing a youth-focused Cricket Academy pipeline. The intention is to relaunch the Cricket Section when a sustainable and competitive playing base is established.
